

Since their formation in November of 1980, they had released one EP(The Bobs), one LP (White Gazebo) -- both on the SAFETY NET label -- and opened for many national acts (which included THE RAMONES and THE PRETENDERS). They were managed by Fantasma Productions; They had a large local following, and even a small national one. Pretty impressive, huh?

But...recently THE BOBS decided to call it a day. Things had not been too great inside the band, and slowly they just drifted apart. But, as the saying goes: It's hard to keep a good man down; and that is precisely the subject of this article. The good man I am speaking of, of course, is Bob Rupe. Mr. Rupe was the bass player, vocalist, and main man for THE BOBS. A bevy of talent, he is also a skilled sound man and engineer; and Bob is currently Engineering that hot "best new bank" THE CHANT.

e shall start our story where THE BOBS left off. THE BOBS last line-up consisted of Kevin MacIvor on guitar & vocals, Bob (of course), and John Galway (also with Charlie

Pickett) on drums & vocals. As we pick up the story, Kevin has just returned from vacation, and John in out on tour with Charlie. To hear Bob tell it: when Kevin

returned, everything stopped.

"We had a lot of plans, really," Bob admitted. "We were planning on a lot of stuff to do, before Kevin went away on vacation. I was talking to this guy up in New York, who was supposed to get this big thing together for us; sort of a tour of the East Coast, we were going to play colleges and stuff. Over the time when Kevin was gone (about eight weeks) and all this was going on, I had not heard a word from him. And, when he finally came back, he decided that he did not want to do it anymore. He just said 'I can't do it,' and I said 'O.K.'."

and there we have the tragic end to one of the finest bands to ever set foot in Florida, not to mention be spawned here. Bob and Kevin wrote most of THE BOBS' songs, with Bob having quite a heavy hand in it all. So the question in all of us must be: How Does He Do It?


"I write, as far as lyrics go, about anything," sez Bob. "When I sit down and try to write, those come out the worst. And then when I sit down and I'm just screwing around, and something comes up quick, those are the best ones. I try to avoid sitting down and writing something, because then I get writers block, and I get really stagnant. I have to try and write something, and get really frustrated, and stop. Then later, something will just pop into my head. It's not a definite process, it is really sketchy.

'Whenever we got together, Kevin and I always seemed to develop some sort of rhythm, or rapport. That's the only thing we had in common. A lot of times when we sat around trying to write something, we wouldn't even use guitars. We would just sit around with drums, maracas, and stuff like that. We would go by rhythm, rather than

actual tone movement.

s it was mentioned earlier, Bob went back for seconds when God was handing out talent. Aside from playing his bass, Bob dabbles with many other instruments, in many varying styles of music.

don't have any knowledge of the piano, I don't have any knowledge of the drums, I don't even have any great knowledge of the guitar. What ever I play on any of those instruments is extremely simple, only because of my

inabilily to play them well.

"A lot of people approach music differently then I do. A lot of people approach music from the angle of 'I am a guitar player, I want to have a guitar player image, and I always want to be playing the guitar, and I want my thing to be just the guitar.' When I went through school, I was in a band; and I was always shown by a guy I worked with in high school that you should expand into a lot of different realms. In fact, he would take away all of our instruments, and give us pots and pans; and set us up with a tape recorder, and tell us to go make music. That had a great deal to do with the way I think. To this day I still feel that way. Do not barricade yourself with anything, and one idea or instrument. Try to get out and express yourself any way you can, through any medium that you can.

"I think what people latch on to more than anything, is the fact that you are willing to try something different, and that you are willing to do something different. People latch on to that; they will go see you, or they will come up to you and say 'Well, that is
